NAME OF INSTITUTION

Alaska Methodist University was renamed Alaska Pacific University effective November 30, 1978.

ACCREDITATION

December 1981 to Present: Accredited by Commission on Northwest Colleges and Universities.
December 1977 to November 1981; Candidate for Accreditation status granted by Commission on Colleges, Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges (See "NOTE" below)
December 1964 to June 1977: Accredited by Commission on Colleges, Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

NOTE: Alaska Pacific University, formerly Alaska Methodist University, suspended academic operations during the 1976-1977 academic year. As a result, accreditation was formerly withdrawn. With the resumption of classes in September 1977, the U.S. Commissioner of Education granted reasonable assurance of accreditation, restoring full eligibility for all federal programs. In December 1977, following a complete self study and site visit, the Northwest Association granted Candidacy for Accreditation Status. Candidacy is not accreditation nor does it assure eventual accreditation. Candidacy for accreditation is a status of affiliation with the commission which indicates that the institution has achieved initial recognition and is progressing toward accreditation.

LENGTH OF SEMESTERS

1975 to Present (except as noted below): Two 15-week semesters per academic year and a 14 to 15-week summer session. Various short courses offered within these terms. Beginning Fall 1995, the semester includes 15-week courses; block courses (4 weeks) and session courses (11 weeks). Special program courses are offered with terms of varying lengths.
1970 to June 1975: Two semesters divided into two separate terms; an 11-week term and a 4-week Intensive Study Term and Summer Sessions.
1960 to June 1970: Two semesters of 16 weeks each and summer sessions.

DEFINITION OF CREDIT UNIT

September 1972 to Present: Credits are recorded in semester hours. One semester hour represents a class meeting (or equivalent learning time) of one hour per week for a 15-week semester. Adjustments in weekly learning times are made for terms of shorter lengths.
September 1970 to August 1972: Credits recorded as Course Credits. One (1) undergraduate course credit was equivalent to four (4) semester hours; one (1) graduate credit was equivalent to three (3) semester hours.
September 1960 to August 1970: Credits recorded as semester hours.

Courses numbered below 10000 may be offered for academic credit but do not count toward associate or baccalaureate degree requirements.

SEPTEMBER 1982 to JUNE 2007: Courses numbered below 100 may be offered for academic credit but do not count toward associate or baccalaureate degree requirements.
Courses numbered 100-299 were lower division (Freshman/Sophomore level).
Courses numbered 300-499 were upper division (Junior/Senior level).
Courses numbered 500-599 were post-baccalaureate, professional development courses, not applicable toward an advanced degree.
Courses numbered 600-699 were graduate level.
SEPTEMBER 1982 to 1995: Course titles beginning with WR: indicate Writing intensive courses.
SEPTEMBER 1981 to AUGUST 1982: Courses numbered below 1000 were offered for academic credit but did not count toward associate or baccalaureate degree requirements.
Courses numbered 1000-2299 were lower division (Freshman/Sophomore level).
Courses numbered 3000-4499 were upper division (Junior/Senior level).
Courses numbered 5000-5599 were post-baccalaureate professional development courses, and were not applicable toward an advanced degree.
Courses numbered 6000-7700 were graduate level courses.
SEPTEMBER 1963 to AUGUST 1981: Courses numbered below 100 were offered for academic credit but did not count toward associate or baccalaureate degree requirements.
Courses numbered 100-299 were lower division (Freshman/Sophomore level).
Courses numbered 300-499 were upper division (Junior/Senior level).
Courses numbered 500-699 were graduate level.
SEPTEMBER 1960 to AUGUST 1963: Courses were not numbered. Course level information is available upon request.

NOTE: Graduate level courses offered prior to September 1968 were designated by a "G" appearing after a 300-499 course number.
