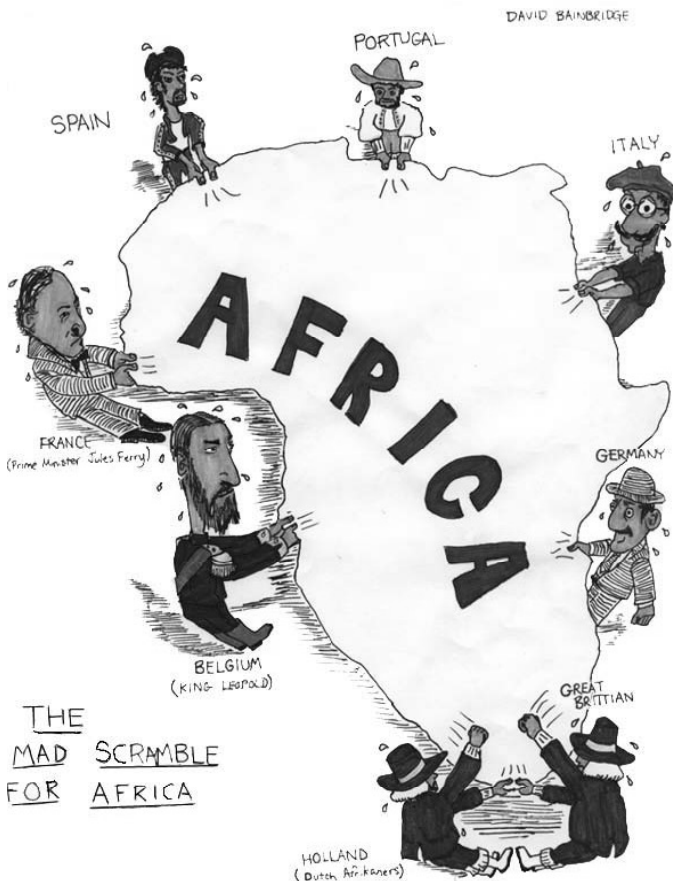


Source #3: Cartoon of the Scramble for Africa

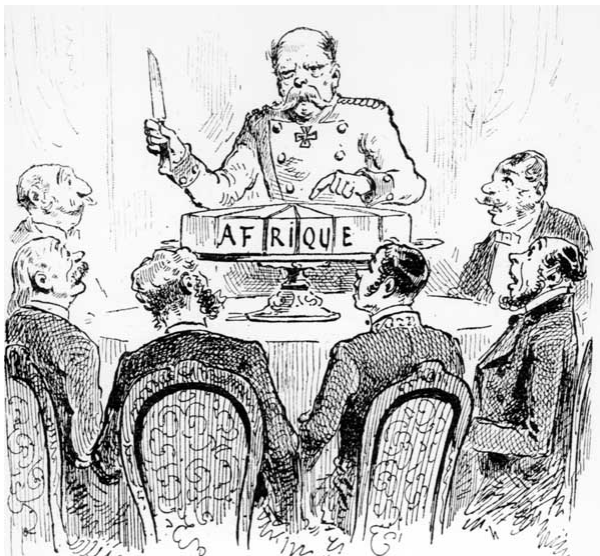
