



Congratulations on your nomination for membership in the Daniel Ramos Chapter of the National Honor Society! Membership in this organization is a privilege reserved for the very best academic and artistic scholars in our school. In addition, the members are held to the highest standards of character, conduct and service both in school and in the community. You must be an example to all students in the school to be admitted, and you must maintain that standard to remain a member of the honor society.

In order to remain a member in good standing of the Honor Society you must:

- Maintain the academic and artistic standards for membership: an 85% average with no semester or final grade lower than 80% through the end of your senior year. You will receive a written warning if any of your grades fall below this standard. Failure to raise your grades will result in automatic removal from the Honor Society.
- Maintain a clean discipline record within the school. Any action or misbehavior that results in an admonition by the administration can be grounds for a review by the Faculty Council of the Honor Society and may be grounds for dismissal from the society.
- Be an outstanding citizen outside the school with no incidence of infractions of the law. Any infraction of the law that comes to the attention of the school can be grounds for a review by the Faculty Council of the Honor Society and may be grounds for dismissal from the society.
- Participate actively in Honor Society's service activities. That includes your presence at meetings, participation in the after school chat with new students, active participation in the tutoring program, and participation in the induction ceremony for new students, as well as any other activity organized by the Honor Society. If you cannot attend a scheduled meeting or event of the Honor Society, you must speak to an advisor preferably beforehand, or, if that is not feasible, as soon as possible afterwards to explain your reason for missing the meeting.

The Faculty Council of the National Honor Society is a committee composed of five academic teachers. The chapter adviser serves as a sixth non-voting member of the committee. It meets to deliberate on what actions will be taken when a member falls below the standards of conduct stated above. Possible actions by the committee may include a warning, probation, or the decision to revoke the membership of students who no longer meet the above-mentioned standards of the Honor Society. Decisions of the Faculty Council can be appealed to the director.
